There are a number of challenges relating to spending CIL. They range from engaging with external stakeholders, such as the County Council, to forecasting likely CIL receipts, and ensuring the process is robust for the expenditure of the CIL Neighbourhood Fund receipts. Local authorities should ensure that Members and senior officers are informed of the process for spending CIL and agree on an approach on how this will be decided and updated. Projects should only be allocated CIL funding once they are at a deliverable stage.
